
Shepherd's Sheep

BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- David wrote a psalm to praise God.
- David compared God's love and care for people to a good shepherd's care for his sheep.
- David wrote that God protects His people from harm and blesses them.

KEY PASSAGE: Psalm 145:13

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

• How is Jesus the perfect King? Jesus perfectly rules over the universe as the King of kings.

FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

- What are some ways God has provided for you, specifically?
- How do you feel knowing that God loves and provides for His people?
- What is our greatest need, and how did God provide for it?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

• Visit a petting zoo. Take special care to see any sheep that may be there. Encourage your kids to ask questions to learn about how the sheep are cared for. Discuss God's love and care for people, focusing on how God sent Jesus for us.





David's Psalm

Psalm 23

Story Point: David wrote a psalm to praise God.

Big Picture Question: How is Jesus the perfect King? Jesus perfectly rules over the universe as the King of kings.

Christ Connection: David compared God's love, protection, and guidance for His people to that provided by a shepherd for his sheep. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He laid down His life to save people from sin. Because of Jesus, we have hope that one day we will live with God forever.

Key Passage: Psalm 145:13
